The conference - to be held on 28th-30th September 2023 - will be hosted by the Istituto Polacco di Roma in Palazzo Blumensthal, Via Vittoria Colonna, 1 and in the Headquarters of Istituto Nazionale di Astrofisica in Villa Mellini, the ex-Observatory of Rome in Monte Mario.

The main target of this meeting is to focus on the relations between Copernicus and Italy before and after the revelation of the Heliocentric model, trying to better understand the genesis, the inspiration and the reception of the Solar Revolution among local humanists, but also the aftermath of Copernicanism in Rome and its connection with the founding of the Copernican Museum in the age of Nationalisms.
